9. Manager's Report:

Lowboy Deck Repairs: Material will be delivered Friday, September 8th.

United Asphalt: Bill Henn has advised that we move forward with repairs and document all expenses. Bill will take care of filing the suit and having United Asphalt served. I. Stampfly noted that someone from United Asphalt was here yesterday and went with him to look at the driveways in question. He indicated that they will come back to fix the driveways.

New Plow Trucks: The new trucks have been delivered. Please check them out in the truck garage. Scott (JX) will adjust our warranty timelines based on oOur in-service date.

PASER Ratings: J. Vanderville and I. Stampfly completed the PASER ratings with CUPPAD. The template that was used was missing approximately 52 miles of federal aid roads, but they will collect and transmit the information to CUPPAD for TAMC submission.

Local PASER: J. Vanderville and I. Stampfly have started the local road ratings. Results will be submitted to CUPPAD for TAMC collection data.

Pavement Markings: After canvassing the board, the decision was made to hold off until next year and put together a rotation plan for pavement markings. We plan to utilize Category E funds when possible.

Drain Commission: J. Vanderville spoke with Rawan (CUPPAD) regarding the Gulliver Lake SAD. She is going to start working on updating the spreadsheet as best she can with the information that she has access to. She is going to verify the legal descriptions and parcel details as compared to the GIS drawings.

Gravel Crushing: Gravel crushing has begun at the Ottenhoff Pit. Northstar will mobilize to Grave's next. Bonnie did not have a solid date for Stoney Cut. **See Page 7 of minutes.

MERS Pension Grant: MERS has received our pension grant funds in the amount of \$1,817,235. The funds have been deposited into a new surplus division account.

MCRCSIP Loss Control Visit - August 14, 2023: A report from MCRCSIP in reference to their visit on August 14, 2023, was provided.

10. Engineer's Report:

Township Work: We will be finishing Cooks School South in the next few weeks now that we have the go ahead from legal counsel to perform the necessary repairs on the damage caused by United Asphalt. Davidson is still planned for October if the weather is good.

CR-448 @ **Stutts Creek:** The bridge is now paved and shouldered. There are four items of work to do yet: guardrail, snowmobile protective layer, slope restoration and pavement markings. The bridge will remain closed until the guardrail is completed at a minimum. It is likely it will be closed until all construction is completed so that the workers are safe. Many people have been using the bridge as is at their own risk.

FLAP Projects: Design work is still progressing on these projects. I. Stampfly has submitted more NEPA/SHPO documentation and has not heard any new updates as of 9-7-23. He plans to give a few more days before reaching out to see what else is needed or must be corrected.

CR-433 & CR-453: I. Stampfly has started on the design documents / plans for these projects as well. He is planning to have these projects out to bid in the same package between Thanksgiving and Christmas.

Local PASER/IBR Ratings: J. Vanderville and I. Stampfly have started rating our local road system for this year. They are about 30% complete so far.

Soil Borings: The soil borings are completed. We have not received the logs yet. Coleman did state the logs / report would take a few weeks to complete. We will share the results after we have reviewed the findings.

Ross Lake Culvert: We finished the culvert project in a total of four days. The bulk of the work was completed in three days. The project was a success, and the crew did a wonderful job. I. Stampfly wanted to highlight a couple of partnerships that helped make this project a success. The conservation district grant helped pay for \$1,000 of the materials and Alger County Road Commission rented us their excavator for a very cheap price.

5-Year Plan: We have finished our plan for now (see table below). We feel it provides a good mix-of-fixes for our road system. This is subject to change depending on multiple factors. We will continue to try and find other funding sources to increase our workload.

If we need the money from this project to help cover the costs of the other two, we will have to plan how to pay for this project. Most likely, it will be Category E funding that we use for this project.
