The SCRC Board of Road Commissions authorized the absolute abandonment, and the property reverts by operation of law to the adjacent property owner and the road ceases to exist as a public highway.

9. Manager's Report:

USDA: I. Stampfly and J. Vanderville recently met with Tony Anderman of the USDA regarding a Cooperative Service Agreement for beaver damage control, which would replace the \$75.00 per beaver trapped by local trappers. (See Item 8.D. above)

Certification Maps: I. Stampfly and J. Vanderville have been working on verifying and updating the certification maps, which is due the end of December. Specific changes were noted.

Christmas Holiday: Due to the way the Christmas holidays fall on the calendar and the union contract, the office will be closed on Friday, December 24th for the Christmas Eve holiday and on Monday, December 27th for the Christmas Holiday.

Truck E527: Truck E527 had an electrical fire on Tuesday, November 30th. Damage appears to be contained to the Cab 2 engine harness. Mechanics believe they can repair the harness without having to purchase a new wiring harness. As of now they are able to fire up the truck without any smoke or fire.

Gulliver Lake Special Assessment District: Lake State Land Surveying is working with equalization to get the tax roll and start the survey project.

10. Engineer's Report:

FLAP Grants: Received the signed support letter for the FLAP Grants from Inwood Township on November 29th, which was attached to all applications and submitted on November 30th. An e-mail confirmation was received shortly after submission.

Category A – Transportation Economic Development Fund: Received an e-mail from Alex Nikoloff on December 2nd stating that a conference call was scheduled between Carmeuse, himself, and the Michigan economic development Corporation (MEDC). Alex stated that he would share what he learns after the call.

Township Road Reports: No reports were given since the last board meeting. The plan is that their report will be presented at the Germfask Township meeting on December 13th.

County Wide Sign Project: IDR's have all been signed and submitted. I. Stampfly is still waiting for MDOT to sign the contract modification. Once the modification is signed and approved, the project can be sent to MDOT for review.

Asset Management Plan: Per statute we are required to develop and submit an asset management plan, which is due for completion on 10-1-2022. A full draft is anticipated by March or April. The asset management plan includes our road assets (paved and unpaved), bridge assets, culvert assets and sign assets. The plan also includes some financial resource information to aid in illustrating the funding gap in order to achieve our goals and to maintain the current system. The draft will be shared with the board once completed.

Certification Maps: Updates and corrections are being made to the certification maps to be submitted by December 31st. Although a lengthy process, it will improve the accuracy of our certification and possibly adjust the funding we receive to a more accurate amount.

11. Department Heads:

Tanya Hoar, Finance Director: T. Hoar reported that one more temporary driver is scheduled to begin work next week, which will fill the openings in Seney and leave one more opening in Manistique. She noted that it went will with the recent weather event without a full crew.

Roger Martin, Shop Foreman: R. Martin provided more details regarding Truck E527's electrical fire. He noted that the harness is savable, but the wire routing was incorrect when the truck was refurbished. They were able to pull the ECM from Truck 527 to put into Truck 531 to keep that one running.

Troy Bassett, County Commissioner: Troy Bassett provided an overview of Merwin Creek, noting there is money in the American Rescue Plan to spend there. The plan is to add two 20-foot sections of guardrail by the main road along with new bathrooms and two new signs.

The Zoning Administrator reported that the Zoning Committee took a vote, and the contract has been denied.

The Parks and Rec Committee needs members if anyone is interested.

Doug Troyer, Carmeuse: Doug Troyer expressed his gratitude to the SCRC for working with Carmeuse regarding CR433. He noted they are trying to get the rest of the road fixed and are hoping to have gates and signage completed.
