INTERIM MANAGER/FINANCE DIRECTOR REPORT

APRIL 13, 2016

Engineer/Manager Position – First round of Interviews completed and applications have been signed and returned. Need direction from Board on how they wish to proceed.

Janitorial Hiring – Cathy Harris has been hired and her hours are 12-3 each day.

Engineering - Meeting with Nancy Helgren of U.P. Engineers & Architects on April 14, 2016.

Railroad Crossing – MDOT has scheduled a Formal Investigation at the Ketvirtis site on May 24, 2016 at 8:30 a.m. If approved this will give us 5 years to get the crossing built. Ongoing communication with Gerald Reese, Schoolcraft Snowmobile Association is occurring to achieve funding partners for the crossing.

2016 Construction Projects – A small amount of extra funding has been received due to the FAST Act, will work with Engineer to schedule the assignment of these funds either to an existing project or to other counties within the task force. Rural Task Force Meeting scheduled for April 20, 2016, at 10:00 a.m. in Alger County. The Board will need to address how to proceed with this construction season in the absence of the Construction Foreman. Forms need to be completed via a laptop each day during a construction project in order to comply with Federal Highway audit requirements. This person works closely with the Finance Director regarding budgetary constrictions.

Lasich Road – Proposed construction project information was presented to Manistique Township on 03/23/16. At this time, Lasich Road does not appear to be project moving forward. A portion of right-of-way clearing has been done and a small amount is yet to be completed on Lasich Road. Manistique Township has asked that we review their township roads and give them a plan on what would be the most prudent way to improve the roads and present projects at their next meeting 4/20/16.

Financial – Michigan Department of Treasury has concluded that road commissions cannot issue pension/OPEB bonds on their own, nor can counties issue pension/OPEB bonds on their behalf. I am working closely with Brian Gutowski, Emmet County Road Commission Engineer/Manager, Marty Fitante of Senator Casperson's office, as well as Jim Iwanicki, Marquette County Road Commission Engineer/Manager, CRA President and Denise Donohue, Director of CRA. Locally, Pat Carley has been involved as well as continued contact with Phil Wolf, CPA with Anderson Tackman. In light of the fact that Department of Treasury will not approve a bond, a plan to address the \$8,000,000 unfunded accrued liability needs to be created and implemented.

To address inaccurate and false statements that nothing was done during the past several years to address the unfunded accrued liability issue that was created before 2006, the following shows extra payments verifiable by ACT 51 Reports, as well as MERS Annual Valuation Reports:

In summary, during the past five years, SCRC has paid \$1,059,973 extra on pension liabilities and future retiree health insurance.

Seasonal Weight Restrictions – Implemented March 7, 2016, at 8:00 a.m. Frost is out of the ground in all areas and restrictions may be lifted in the next week or so depending on how fast the roads dry up.

Townships – Commissioner Klarich and I have attended Manistique and Hiawatha township meetings. Working with the Foreman, roads will be assessed for the most efficient fixes and costs given to the township for their decision on this year's projects.
